Entries & Closing Date

All entries must be RECEIVED by 7:00 PM, **Friday, April 11, 2008**. No entries may be accepted or withdrawn for any reason after April 11. Advancements in level for dogs already entered by the closing date will be accepted until 7pm on April 28 and must be submitted in writing. To be accepted, entries must be complete, signed (by parent or legal guardian if handler is a minor), received by the closing date, and accompanied by the correct fees made payable to ACE Agility. Overpayment of entry fees will not be refunded and underpayment of fees will not constitute a valid entry form. You must file a separate entry form if you enter more than one dog (i.e., only one dog per form).

Check-In and Starting Times

Check-in shall be from 6:30am to 7:45am on Saturday and from 6:30 to 7:15 on Sunday. On Saturday, dogs requiring measurement should be available at 6:30am. Sunday check-in and measurement is only for dogs not present on Saturday. All dogs must be measured unless a permanent registration card, properly authorized temporary registration card, or pending permanent card letter from USDAA is presented at time of check-in. To expedite check-in, you may enclose a copy of your **PERMANENT** (yellow plastic) height card with your entry. Copies of temporary (blue paper) cards CANNOT be accepted. Notification of early check-in on Friday evening will be sent with the confirmation. Judge's briefings begin at about 7:45am on Saturday and 7:15am on Sunday with the first class to start immediately thereafter.

Registration of Dogs

All dogs must be registered with USDAA (registration has a "U" prefix) in order to compete. To receive a registration number immediately and a measurement card prior to the show, go online to www.usdaa.com and click on General Information, Dog Registration. A registration form is included in this test schedule and may be completed and submitted with any entry that does not bear a valid USDAA registration number. Handlers under the age of 18 as of the event date may compete in most non-tournament classes at the dog's regular jump height at half price.

Awards

For most classes, rosettes will be awarded to all dogs placing 1st - 4th in each jump height. In the Pairs classes, rosettes will be awarded in the Mini and Open divisions. Maroon qualifying ribbons will be awarded to all qualifying scores in the test classes. All prizes and awards must be claimed prior to the end of the trial. None will be mailed. Grand Prix & Performance National Standard qualifiers: ribbons for 1st - 4th place in each jump height. Dogs with qualifying scores in the Grand Prix will receive a maroon & white qualifying ribbon; qualifiers in Performance receive a maroon & pink ribbon.

Rules and Regulations

Rules and regulations of the United States Dog Agility Association as amended March 30, 2007 shall apply at this event. Competitors are expected to be familiar with these rules and regulations.

Econolodge - Exit 6 of Mass Pike, 357 Burnett Rd., Chicopee, MA (413) 592-9101. There is an extra \$10 per night fee for pets.

Camping

Overnight parking in self-contained RVs is allowed at Dufresne Park (no hookups available). No running of generators between 10:30pm and 6:30am, per park rules. The town charges a camping fee. In 2007 the fee was \$12 per night. There is a possibility that the fee may increase for 2008.

Class Descriptions

Two certification programs will be offered at this event – Championship & Performance. Competitors may enter both Championship and Performance Program classes for which they are eligible; however, under NO circumstances may a dog be entered in the same Championship and Performance class at this agility test (i.e., standard at any level in both programs).

Classes include standard agility, gamblers, jumpers, pairs and snooker agility as set forth in Chapters 3 – 7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations, each of which are conducted at three competitive levels.

Championship Program Classes

The Starters Standard classes shall be for dogs that have not earned the Agility Dog® title or a Starters Standard title. Starters Non-standard classes shall be for dogs that have not earned a title in the class being entered (Starters Gamblers, Starters Jumpers, Starters Relay (3 different partners required) or Starters Snooker) or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard class at the Advanced or Masters level. When offered separately as Starters and Novice classes, the Starters level classes are for dogs handled by a person who has not previously earned the Agility Dog title or a title in the Performance or Veterans Program with any dog. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes is required to earn the Agility Dog title.

The Advanced Standard classes shall be for dogs that have earned the Agility Dog® title or a Starters Standard title. Advanced non-standard classes shall be for dogs that have earned the Agility Dog® title or that have earned a title in the equivalent non-standard class at the Starters level, but have not earned the equivalent Advanced non-standard title or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard class at the Masters level. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes is required to earn the Advanced Agility Dog title.

The Masters Standard classes shall be for dogs that have earned the Advanced Agility Dog® title or the Advanced Standard title. Masters non-standard classes shall be for dogs that have earned the Advanced Agility Dog® title, the equivalent non-standard title at the Advanced level, or that had previously qualified for entry into the equivalent Masters non-standard class prior to January 1, 2004.

Performance Program Classes

Generally, Performance Level I, Level II and Level III are run on courses used for Starters, Advanced and Masters classes in the Championship Program, with the following exceptions: the A-frame is set at 5'6", jump heights are one height class lower as set forth in Notes to Competitors, no spread hurdles are utilized and time standards in the standard and jumpers classes are extended by 3 seconds beyond that utilized in the Championship Program.

Eligibility is determined as follows:

The Performance I Standard classes shall be for any dog that has not earned the Performance Dog ISM title, the Performance Standard I title, or a qualifying score in the Performance II or Performance III standard classes. Performance I non-standard classes shall be for any dog that has not earned a title in the class being entered (Performance I Gamblers, Performance I Jumpers, Performance I Snooker, or Performance I Pairs) or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard class at the Performance II or Performance III level. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the non-standard classes is required to earn the Performance Dog ISM title.

The Performance II Standard classes shall be for any dog that has earned the Performance Dog ISM title, the Performance Standard I title, the Agility Dog® title or the Veteran Agility DogSM title, but has not earned the Performance Dog IISM title or Performance Standard II title, or a qualifying score in the Performance III standard class. Performance II non-standard classes shall be for dogs having earned the Performance Dog ISM title, the Agility Dog® title or a title in the equivalent Starters or Performance I non-standard class, but not having earned a title in the equivalent non-standard Performance II class or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard Performance III class. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes is required to earn the Performance Dog IISM title.

The Performance III Standard classes shall be for any dog that has earned the Performance Dog IISM title, the Performance Standard II title, the Advanced Agility DogSM title, or the Veteran Advanced Agility DogSM title. Performance III non-standard classes shall be for dogs having earned the Performance Dog IISM title, the Advanced Agility Dog® title, the equivalent non-standard title at the Advanced or Performance II level, or that had previously qualified for entry into the equivalent Performance non-standard class prior to January 1, 2004.

Class Descriptions

Standard Classes: This class consists of a sequentially numbered course containing an A-frame, dog walk, see-saw, open tunnel(s), closed tunnel, table, tire jump, weaves, spread jumps and various hurdle jumps. Championship Standard classes are scored pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 3 (Masters), Chapter 4 (Advanced) and Chapter 5 (Starters).

Non-Standard Classes: The non-standard classes listed below are scored pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 6 & 7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations.

Gamblers Class: This class consists of a course with no pre-determined route and each obstacle is assigned a point value. In the 'opening' period the handler seeks to accumulate points by performing the obstacles of his/her choice in the time allotted. At the conclusion of the 'opening' the handler attempts the 'gamble', a sequence designated by the judge to be handled from a distance, for additional points.

Jumpers Class: This class consists of a course of jumps and may include a tire and tunnels.

Snooker Class: This class has an 'opening' sequence of point collection similar to the Gamblers followed by a closing sequence of a set pattern. Roughly parallels the billiards game of 'Snooker', requiring the dog to successfully complete a 'red' jump prior to attempting an obstacle designated as any other color.

Pairs Relay: This class consists of a standard course with one dog and handler running a portion of the course, followed by a baton exchange to a second handler and dog who run the second portion of the course. Partners in both Championship and Performance must be in the same level and height division: Mini (Ch 12/16, Perf 8/12) or Open (Ch 22/26, Perf 16/22). In the event only one dog is entered in a program/level, un-entered dogs or dogs from other program/levels may NOT be recruited to form a qualifying pair. Pairs is required for all levels of Performance titling beginning 1/1/09.

Early Bird Special

The early bird gets the worm! Or, in this case, a refund! Any competitor whose entry is postmarked by March 15, 2008 will be entered in an Early Bird drawing for a chance to win a refund of entry fees for one dog.

2008 Grand Prix of Dog Agility® World Championships – Local Qualifier

This class is open to all competitors other than those who are entered in the *Performance National Standard* qualifier at this event, regardless of titles earned or skill level. The Grand Prix is a single-round tournament featuring the sport in its basic form. The course includes obstacles as set forth in Chapter 3 of USDAA Rules and Regulations for standard agility, except that no table obstacle shall be used. Standard scoring shall be applied utilizing time standards generally ranging from 3.50 yards per second to 3.75 yards per second for competitors in the 22" and 26" height classes, from 3.10 to 3.40 yards per second for competitors in the 16" height class and 2.85 to 3.05 yards per second in the 12" height class.

Awards

Competitors that earn five (5) or fewer faults shall earn a qualifying score. In addition, the first place qualifying handler/dog team in each height class shall earn a "bye" voucher, permitting them to directly advance to the final round of a regional championship. A double maroon and white ribbon shall be awarded to all qualifiers.

2008 Performance National StandardSM Championships - Local Qualifier

This class is open to all competitors other than those who are entered in the Grand Prix qualifier at this event, regardless of titles earned or skill level. This qualifier is a single-round tournament featuring the Performance Program in its basic form. The course includes obstacles as set forth in Chapter 7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations for standard performance class, except that no table obstacle shall be used. Standard scoring shall be applied utilizing time standards generally ranging from 3.30 yards per second to 3.55 yards per second for competitors in the 16" and 22" height classes, from 2.95 to 3.25 yards per second for competitors in the 12" height class and 2.75 to 2.95 yards per second in the 8" height class.

Awards

Competitors that earn five (5) or fewer faults shall earn a qualifying score. In addition, the first place qualifying handler/dog team in each height class shall earn a "bye" voucher, permitting them to directly advance to the final round of a regional championship. A double maroon and pink ribbon shall be awarded to all qualifiers.

NOTE: When a local qualifier is held in conjunction with an agility test where all levels of titling are NOT being offered, 'bye' vouchers will not be awarded.

Notice To Competitors

Competitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of USDAA rules and regulations currently in effect, including but not limited to the following rules regarding entry:

- This test is open to all dogs at least 18 months of age, including purebred and non-purebred, except bitches in season, dogs suffering from any deformity, injury or illness that may affect the dog's physical or mental performance, or dogs exhibiting signs of aggression.
- The Organizing Committee of an event may refuse the entry of any competitor or dog for just cause should the committee view that participation by competitor or dog would be prejudicial to the sport. However, any committee so doing must notify the competitor in writing (with a copy to the USDAA office) in anticipation of or upon receipt of entry. The notice must include the reason for refusing the entry and a brief explanation of the basis for their decision. The burden of responsibility for appropriateness of such action rests solely with the host group and its Organizing Committee.
- Safety shall always be of foremost consideration at all times. Handlers through entry at this event accept full responsibility for themselves and the actions of their dogs and/or children.
- No leads, collars, food, toys, or other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course at any time.
- Agility obstacles shall meet the requirements of USDAA rules and regulations.
- No entries may be accepted, changed, altered or withdrawn for any reason after the closing date EXCEPT as outlined under "Entries & Closing Date" found in this test schedule. There shall be no refunds for entries withdrawn after the closing date or in the event a dog and/or handler are dismissed from competition, regardless of reason for such dismissal. However, a 75% refund may be given for bitches in heat upon written notice to the secretary prior to April 26, 2008.
- All Competitors through entry at this event waive any and all rights relative to video broadcast of this event. Competitors shall have the right to videotape portions of this event for their personal use only. No portion of this event may be videotaped for commercial or other purposes. All video, broadcast and telecast rights for this event are the exclusive property of United States Dog Agility Association, Inc.
- Portions of this event may be taped for television. Through entry at this event, ALL COMPETITORS AND HANDLERS HEREBY GRANT to USDAA and its representatives, agents and assigns, all rights and permission to use or appropriate his/her and their dog's name, biography, likeness, photograph, voice, performing persona, or other indicia of identity for broadcast, telecast, cablecast, transmission or distribution in any format or media now known or hereafter to become known. All competitors and handlers hereby release USDAA and its representatives, agents and assigns from any claim or cause of action for invasion of the rights of privacy, right of publicity, right of personality, or any similar right.

Notice To Competitors

- Following are the jump heights for the Championship Program (Performance heights shown in parenthesis):

- All fees are payable in US Dollars and no entry fee will be refunded if the Test cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, Act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, strike or any other cause beyond the control of the club.
- Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry fee. There will be a \$20.00 service charge for returned checks. Payment of entry fees and service charges shall be made in cash or money order within 30 days of postmark of notice of returned check where notification is received after event date. Any fees not received within 30 days of notice result in cancellation of event results for all classes for the registration number(s) of delinquent entry/entries. No reinstatement of results is possible, and all awards must be returned within 10 days of notification, or the dog's registration may be suspended pending restitution. Any unpaid fees or shortfalls must be paid prior to the start of the event or entry is cancelled without recourse by owner/handler.
- All dogs must be kept on leash while on the show grounds except when competing in the ring. No dogs may be left unattended except when properly kenneled in designated kennel areas. Day kenneling only is permitted.
- Fault limits shall be applied in all classes for which faults are assessed. Limits shall be announced during the judge's briefings.
- This event will be held outdoors on grass.
- The show grounds have ample room for tents and crates. There is a covered pavilion and many shaded areas. Bring your own chairs. Grounds will be available on Friday evening for setup.
- Competitors must pick up after their dog(s). Anyone not cleaning up after his or her dog(s) at the trial site or hotel will be asked to leave. No entry fees will be refunded to any competitor asked to leave due to failure to clean up after their dog(s).
- Vehicles must only be parked in the designated parking area.
- A food vendor will be available at the show grounds for breakfast and lunch.

Help Wanted

Volunteers at agility trials are important to help the show run smoothly and efficiently. ACE would appreciate your helping out at our trial. We will provide food, snacks and beverages to workers. ACE will hold a worker raffle in appreciation for all your help. Please fill out the volunteer form below and return with your entry. Don't worry if you've never worked before - it's not complicated. We'll be happy to show you how to do the job!

Job descriptions:

Scribe: The scribe marks the faults or points as directed by the judge. You must be able to pay full attention to the judge and not the dog during a run.

Timer: The timer starts and stops the watch as the dog crosses the start/finish line. You must be able to operate a stopwatch and pay attention to when the dog crosses the line.

Gate Steward: Ensures dogs and handlers are ready at the start line and helps the scribe and/or assistant scribe match the running order on the gate steward sheets.

Ring Steward: Resets jump bars for height changes and when knocked down; also straightens chute. This job usually allows you to sit down and watch the dogs run.

Runner: Takes the scribe sheet from the scribe and gives it to the score table and/or moves the leash from the start line to the finish line. A great job for the new competitor as it allows you to watch the dogs run while you work. This job may require substantial walking.

Scorer: Calculates the scores from the scribe sheets and writes scores on the master score sheet. This job requires basic math skills and/or the ability to use a calculator.

Course Builder: Moves obstacles as directed by the chief course builder. This job is a great way to learn how to set courses.

Directions To The Test Site Dufresne Park on Rt. 202, Granby, MA

From I-91 Heading South: Take Exit 16, turn left onto Rt. 202 North. ** Follow 202 through Holyoke for approximately 4.2 miles, across the river and through South Hadley. At the intersection of Rt. 33 and Rt. 202, continue on Rt. 202 North for 4.6 miles. Turn right on Kendall St. (Manny's Restaurant with the giant milk can will be on the left.) Park entrance is 0.3 miles on the right.

From I-91 Heading North: Take Exit 16, turn right onto Rt. 202 North. Follow from ** above.

Alternate from I-91 Heading North: In Springfield, take Exit 8 to I-291 East. At the end of I-291, go straight on through 3 lights. At 4th light turn left onto West St. (Mobil Station on left corner.) Follow directions from *** below.

From the East -- Mass Pike (I-90): Take Exit 6. After the tollbooth turn right. At the 3rd light (approx 2.5 miles, Mobil Station on left corner) turn left on West St. *** After approximately 2.8 miles (about 0.3 miles beyond the power lines), watch for Brook St. (If West St. has become East St. you have gone too far.) Turn right onto Brook St. which quickly becomes Taylor St. After 0.4 miles at the "T", go right onto Carver St. After 0.5 miles, bear left at the fork onto Chicopee St. In 1.4 miles turn left onto Kendall St. The park entrance will be on the left in 1.5 miles. If you come to Rt. 202, you missed the park entrance.

From the West -- Mass Pike (I-90): Take Exit 5. After tollbooths, turn left at traffic light onto Rt. 33. Continue north on Rt. 33 for 3.8 miles. Turn right onto Rt. 202 North. Continue on Rt. 202 for 4.5 miles. Turn right onto Kendall St. (Manny's Restaurant with the giant milk can will be on the left.) Park entrance is 0.3 miles on the right.

From the Northeast: Rt. 2 West to Rt. 202 South. In approximately 30 miles (1/4 mile after Dobek's package store on right and Valley Farm Dairy Store on left) turn left onto Kendall St. Park entrance is 0.3 miles on the right.

From Motels: From the Quality Inn, follow the "From the West" directions. From the Motel 6, follow the "From the East" directions.

GENERAL AGREEMENT

I (we) agree that ACE Agility Club has the right to refuse this entry for cause, which the organizing committee alone shall deem to be sufficient. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry, of the holding of the event and of the opportunity to have the dog participate and/or to be judged, I (we) agree to hold the organizing committee, ACE Agility Club, United States Dog Agility Association, Inc., including their members, officers, directors, agents and employees, sponsors of this event and owners of the premises upon which the event is held and their employees, harmless from any claim for loss or injury that may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of this dog while in or upon the event premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim. I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss of this dog by disappearance, theft, death or otherwise, and from any claim for damage or injury to the dog, whether such loss, disappearance, appearance, theft, damage or injury, be caused or alleged to be caused by the negligence of the parties aforementioned, or by the negligence of any other person, or any other cause or causes.

I (we) hereby assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties for damage because of bodily injuries, including death at any time resulting therefrom, sustained by any person or persons, including myself (ourselves) or on account of damage to property arising out of or in consequence of my (our) participation in this event, howsoever such injuries, death or damage to property may be caused, and whether or not the same may have been caused or have been alleged to have been caused by negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees or agents or any other persons.

I further acknowledge that I have read, understand and will abide by the Official Rules and Regulations of the United States Dog Agility Association, Inc. and the provisions for entry as set forth in the Agility Test Schedule of which this entry form is a part.
